WHAT IS THE COST OF A FAILED AIRWAY?

THE HALLMARK 1991 ASA CLOSED CLAIMS ANALYSIS REVEALED THAT 75% OF MAJOR AIRWAY DISASTERS* ARE PRODUCED BY EITHER: INADEQUATE VENTILATION, DIFFICULT INTUBATION, OR UNDETECTED ESOPHAGEAL INTUBATION. 85% OF THESE ADVERSE EVENTS RESULTED IN DEATH OR BRAIN DAMAGE. THE MEAN PAYMENT FOR AN AIRWAY DISASTER—CLAIM AT THAT TIME WAS \$200,000 AND THE HIGHEST PAYMENT WAS MORE THAN \$5,000,000 (IN 1991 DOLLARS), NOT TO MENTION THE HUMAN COST. SLAM 2008 FOCUSES ON PREVENTION OF THESE AND OTHER CAUSES OF AIRWAY MISHAPS IN ORDER TO REDUCE THE LIABILITY TO PATIENT, PRACTITIONER AND ORGANIZATION.

**MAJOR AIRWAY DISASTERS ARE THOSE CAUSING CHRONIC DISABILITY, BRAIN DAMAGE OR DEATH. AIRWAY PROBLEMS REQUIRE PROMPT & EFFECTIVE INTERVENTION TO AVOID POTENTIALLY SERIOUS CHRONIC DISABILITY OR DEATH.*

Course Objectives

At the end of this course, participants should be able to:

1. Discuss aspects of the SLAM Universal Adult Airway Flowchart for both Procedural/Difficult Airway management to include airway assessment, recognition of critical airway events, the 5-SUAAF pathways and Mason's PU-92 Concept.

10. List the most common causes of adverse respiratory events.
